In 2022/2023, in addition to helping support our NHS Volunteer team based at the Queen Elizabeth Universityl Hospital Campus, it enabled us to support volunteers from wider affeld by investing in tools and technology which enabled us to support more volunteers working and being monitored remotely, such as in a new pilot project based in Inverciyde; as well as helped the charity pivot its stratagem in response to the changing public attitude towards giving, by reinvesting in our future first forts through the purchase of materials, e-donation capabilities and online targeted promotions. We can can now accept tap-donate donations, support the collection of giftaid data for such donations, as well as give donors a wider flexibility in how they choose to donate: through in person or online events, various online platforms, QR codes, etc The larger than normal deficit for the year is down to two factors: (1) a late disbursement for £12,100 which was not recieved until May/June 2023 and (2) initially asorbing the full costs of the new inverciyde project within its £25k opening balance, in leiu of a disbursement of funds being made from GGC Endowments to support 1 years project costs inc the cost of a vehicle, which was never recieved. This is currently being renegotiated with the funder at the end of the project period (22 Dec 23) by their last operating quarter (April 24)
